By 2050, 6,3 billions of people will live in cities, meaning 2,6 billions more than the number of today. 67% of the global population will reside in urban zones with an increasing density. Asia, and particularly China, will go through greater evolutions. By 2025, Shanghai will receive 8 millions of new habitants which will be an augmentation of nearly 40% which means 640 000 new Shanghaineses every year.

According to analysis during the recent 50 years on the life span of buildings, 80% of the total costs are spent on exploitation of buildings, while construction and installation represent 20%.

15:30 Topic 2: Innovative cities for mobility and transportation

One passenger wastes on average 14 minutes every day waiting on the way in Beijing, while 11 minutes in Shanghai out of an average 47 minutes that people spend on transportation every day. Traffic congestion leads to enormous loss. In the 15 most populated cities in China, if we gather together all the time people waste every day on traffic congestion, it can make up to a value of one billion RMB according to research results from the sustainable development and strategy study group of Chinese Science Academy.

The cities in China are now experiencing various difficulties generated by the accelerating urbanization. Chinese government needs to immediately take into account the new phenomena concerning mobility in the city and adapt the system of transportation more to the up-to-date needs.

Faced with the evolution of social mobility, what kinds of eco-friendly solutions can be carried out? How can any relevant tools or services help with this evolution?

17:00 Topic 3: Innovative cities for daily life and social connection

Mobility, energy, transportation, accommodation... the era of durable and smart city is generating profound mutations and sometimes marginalization or exclusion of a certain group of people in the city.

Faced with the growing aging population – 30% of the whole population in Asia will reach 60 years old by 2050 – with more and more social and cultural exclusion, our society needs to find some proper solutions to help integrate everyone living in the urban space to reconsider and reconstruct some eased social connection.

It involves multidisciplinary and transversal approaches to cope with these issues. In the name of the Innovation week, UTSEUS and ComplexCity laboratory with the support of their partners organize an *hackathlon* in Shanghai open to all the talents: designers, makers, developers, planners, geographers, citizens. Their goal is to translate into action the slogan of 2010 World Expo in Shanghai *Better City, Better Life*. It consists for the participants of "Hack Your City 2014" in creating and designing innovative applications prototypes from urban data fraction of which already gathered by the lab. Enhancing cultural heritage, green and funny walk-able itinerary, help people to move in ... are all innovation where technology is made available to all shanghainese, city residents or tourists to make their life better.

Creative sprint, short and intensive, "Hack Your City" gathers 40 participants with various skills spread into 8 teams that have to develop their ideas into a project and then into a prototype in only 8 hours. They receive help from professionals of design, visualization, innovation and project management, computer science or urbanism. At the end of the *hackathlon*, the teams share their work during a public conference and to jury members that will, after deliberation, award a prize to the best realization right after the public conference in the evening.
